## DONUT HOLE QUILT BLOCK

Requires: Four 4" squares - 2 white with black and 2 color
One 3-1/2" white with black square
Four 3-1/2" color squares (any color, can be wildly chaotic or all 1 color family)

Make 4 HST using the $4^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Below is one method for making them. You may use any method you prefer as long as they are $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units when completed.

Mark a diagonal line on the back of the white $w /$ black squares. Combine a color and a white square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line. Trim as needed to make four 3-1/2" HST units.

Lay out all the squares/units in a 9-patch with the HSTs in corners, white portion pointing outward, and white square in center. Sew squares into rows, then sew rows together.

Block should measure 9-1/2".
